5 6	Constitutional Declaration
7	
8	WE BELIEVE:
9	
10	That God's purpose concerning mankind finds fulfillment in a priority reason-for-being: 1) to
11	be an agency of God for evangelizing the world, 2) to be a corporate body in which people
12	may worship God, 3) to be a channel of God's purpose to build a body of saints being
13	perfected in the image of His Son, and 4) to be a people who demonstrate God's love and
14	compassion for all the world.
15	
16	That the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network exists expressly to give continuing
17	emphasis to this reason-for-being in the New Testament apostolic pattern by teaching and
18	encouraging believers to be baptized in the Holy Spirit, which enables them to evangelize in
19	the power of the Spirit with accompanying supernatural signs, adding a necessary dimension
20	to worshipful relationship with God, and enabling them to respond to the full working of the
21	Holy Spirit in expression of fruit and gifts and ministries as in New Testament times for the
22	edifying of the Body of Christ.
23	
24	In accord with these aforesaid principles, in the year of 1945, the ninth day of May, the
25	Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network was formed and recognized by the parent
26	body, The General Council of the Assemblies of God (Springfield, Missouri).
27	Therefore, we recognize ourselves to be a voluntary cooperative Fellowship of Spirit-
28 29	baptized believers from local Pentecostal churches of like precious faith located in the
29 30	Michigan Ministry Network of The General Council of the Assemblies of God, hereinafter
31	called "General Council." "Voluntary cooperation" means that once one, out of their own
32	free will, decides to become a cooperating member of the Assemblies of God, this
33	cooperation becomes obligatory and not optional.
34	
35	Our purpose is neither to usurp authority over the various local churches, nor to deprive
36	them of their scriptural and local rights and privileges; but to recognize and promote
37	scriptural methods and order for worship, unity, fellowship, work, and business for God so
38	that results of our efforts may be conserved and local churches established and developed
39	along the line of our distinctive testimony.
40	
41	We reserve the right to disapprove unscriptural methods, doctrines, and conduct in order to
42	keep the unity of the Spirit in the bond of peace, "until we all reach unity in the faith and
43	knowledge of the Son of God and become mature, attaining to the whole measure of the
44	fullness of Christ" (Ephesians 4:13; NIV).

	Constitution of the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network Article I, II, III, IV and V.
1	ARTICLE I. NAME
2 3 4	The corporate name of this body shall be <i>Assemblies of God, Michigan District working under</i> a DBA of <i>Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network.</i>
5 6	ARTICLE II. TERRITORY
7 8 9 10	1. The work of the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network shall include the territory comprising the Lower Peninsula of Michigan and that part of the Upper Peninsula which includes Luce, Chippewa, and Mackinac Counties.
11 12 13	2. The Michigan Ministry Network shall be divided into Sectional fellowships, the boundaries of which shall be determined by the Presbyter Board.
14 15 16 17	3. The description of the Sectional boundaries shall be retained in the Network archives and made available to the constituency through the periodic publishing of a Network map.
18 19	ARTICLE III. NATURE
20	
21 22	The Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, is a cooperative Fellowship based on mutual agreements voluntarily entered into by its members.
23 24	ARTICLE IV. PRINCIPLES FOR FELLOWSHIP
25	
26 27 28 29 30	The Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, shall, as nearly as possible in detail, represent the body of Christ as described in the New Testament, recognizing the principles inherent in that body as also inherent in this Fellowship, particularly the principles of unity, cooperation, and equality. Its purpose is to maintain conditions under which it can, as a Fellowship, demonstrate these principles and their consequent development.
31 32	ARTICLE V. STATEMENT OF FUNDAMENTAL TRUTHS*
33	
 34 35 36 37 38 39 	The Bible is our all-sufficient rule for faith and practice. This Statement of Fundamental Truths is intended simply as a basis of fellowship among us (i.e., that we all speak the same thing, 1 Corinthians 1:10; Acts 2:42). The phraseology employed in this statement is not inspired or contended for, but the truth set forth is held to be essential to a full-gospel ministry. No claim is made that it contains all biblical truth, only that it covers our need as to these fundamental doctrines.
40 41	1. The Scriptures Inspired
42	
43 44 45	The Scriptures, both the Old and the New Testaments, are verbally inspired of God and are the revelation of God to man, the infallible, authoritative rule of faith, and conduct (2 Timothy 3:15-17;1 Thessalonians 2:13, 2 Peter 1:21).

2		2. The One True God		
3				
4		The one true God has revealed Himself as the eternally self-existent "I AM," the Creator of		
5		aven and earth, and the Redeemer of mankind. He has further revealed Himself as noolying the principles of relationship and association as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost		
6 7		euteronomy 6:4; Isaiah 43:10,11; Matthew 28:19; Luke 3:22).

9		THE ADORABLE GODHEAD		
10				
11	a.	Terms Defined		
12		The terms trinity and persons as related to the godhead, while not found in the		
13		Scriptures, are words in harmony with Scripture, whereby we may convey to others our		
14		immediate understanding of the doctrine of Christ respecting the Being of God as		
15		distinguished from "gods many and lords many." We therefore may speak with propriety		
16		of the Lord our God, who is One Lord, as a Trinity or as one Being of three persons, and		
17		still be absolutely scriptural (examples, Matthew 28:19; 2 Corinthians 13:14; John		
18		14:16,17).		
19				
20	b.	Distinction and Relationship in the Godhead		
21		Christ taught a distinction of persons in the godhead which He expressed in specific		
22 23		terms of relationship as Father, Son, and Holy Ghost, but that this distinction and relationship, as to its mode is inscrutable and incomprehensible, because unexplained		
23 24		(Luke 1:35; 1 Corinthians 1:24; Matthew 11:25-27; 28:19; 2 Corinthians 13:14; 1 John		
24		1:3,4).		
26				
27	c.	Unity of the One Being of Father, Son, and Holy Ghost		
28		Accordingly, therefore, there is that in the Father which constitutes Him the Father and		
29		not the Son; there is that in the Son which constitutes Him the Son and not the Father;		
30		and there is that in the Holy Ghost which constitutes Him the Holy Ghost and not either		
31		the Father or the Son. Wherefore the Father is the Begetter; the Son is the Begotten;		
32		and the Holy Ghost is the One proceeding from the Father and the Son. Therefore,		
33		because these three persons in the godhead are in a state of unity, there is but one Lord		
34		God Almighty and His name one (John 1:18; 15:26; 17:11,21; Zechariah 14:9).		
35	d	Identity and Cooperation in the Godhead		
36 37	u.	The Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost are never identical as to person ; nor confused		
38		as to relation ; nor divided in respect to the godhead; nor opposed as to cooperation .		
39		The Son is in the Father and the Father is in the Son as to relationship. The Son is with		
40		the Father and the Father is with the Son, as to fellowship. The Father is not from the		
41		Son, but the Son is from the Father as to authority. The Holy Ghost is from the Father		
42		and the Son proceeding, as to nature, relationship, cooperation, and authority. Hence,		
43		no person in the godhead either exists or works separately or independently of the		
44		others (John 5:17-30,32,37; 8:17,18).

2 e. The Title, Lord Jesus Christ

The appellation *Lord Jesus Christ* is a proper name. It is never applied in the New Testament either to the Father or to the Holy Ghost. It, therefore, belongs exclusively to the **Son of God** (Romans 1:1-3,7; 2 John 3).

f. The Lord Jesus Christ, God with Us

The Lord Jesus Christ, as to His divine and eternal nature, is the proper and only Begotten of the Father, but as to His human nature, He is the proper Son of Man. He is, therefore, acknowledged to be both God and man; who, because He is God and man, is "Immanuel," God with us (Matthew 1:23; 1 John 4:2,10,14; Revelation 1:13,17).

g. The Title, Son of God

Since the name *Immanuel* embraces both God and man, in the one person, our Lord Jesus Christ, it follows that the title *Son of God* describes His proper deity, and the title *Son of Man* His proper humanity. Therefore, the title *Son of God* belongs to the order of eternity and the title *Son of Man* to the **order of time** (Matthew 1:21-23; 2 John 3; 1 John 3:8; Hebrews 7:3; 1:1-13).

20 h. Transgression of the Doctrine of Christ

Wherefore, it is a transgression of the doctrine of Christ to say that Jesus Christ derived the title *Son of God* solely from the fact of the Incarnation, or because of His relation to the economy of redemption. Therefore, to deny that the Father is a real and eternal Father, and that the Son is a real and eternal Son, is a denial of the distinction and relationship in the Being of God; a denial of the Father and the Son; and a displacement of the truth that Jesus Christ is come in the flesh (2 John 9; John 1:1,2,14,18,29,49; 1 John 2:22,23; 4:1-5; Hebrews 12:2).

i. Exaltation of Jesus Christ as Lord

The Son of God, our Lord Jesus Christ, having by Himself purged our sins, sat down on the right hand of the Majesty on high, angels and principalities and powers having been made subject unto Him. And having been made both Lord and Christ, He sent the Holy Ghost that we, in the name of Jesus, might bow our knees and confess that Jesus Christ is Lord to the glory of God the Father until the end, when the Son shall become subject to the Father that God may be all in all (Hebrews 1:3; 1 Peter 3:22; Acts 2:32-36; Romans 14:11; 1 Corinthians 15:24-28).

j. Equal Honor to the Father and to the Son

Wherefore, since the Father has delivered all judgment unto the Son, it is not only the express duty of all in heaven and on earth to bow the knee, but it is an unspeakable joy in the Holy Ghost to ascribe unto the Son all the attributes of deity, and to give Him all the honor and the glory contained in all the names and titles of the godhead except those which express relationship (see paragraphs b, c, and d), and thus honor the Son even as we honor the Father (John 5:22,23; 1 Peter 1:8; Revelation 5:6-14; Philippians 2:8,9; Revelation 7:9,10; 4:8-11).

4		e Lord Jesus Christ is the eternal Son of God. The Scriptures declare:
5		His virgin birth (Matthew 1:23; Luke 1:31,35).
6	b.	His sinless life (Hebrews 7:26; 1 Peter 2:22).

8		His substitutionary work on the cross (I Corinthians 15:3, 2 Corinthians 5:21).
9 10	e. f.	His bodily resurrection from the dead (Matthew 28:6; Luke 24:39; 1 Corinthians 15:4). His exaltation to the right hand of God (Acts 1:9,11; 2:33; Philippians. 2:9-11; Hebrews 1-
11		3).
12		4. The Fall of Man
13		
14	Ma	an was created good and upright; for God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our
15	like	eness." However, man by voluntary transgression fell and thereby incurred not only
16	ph	ysical death but also spiritual death, which is separation from God (Genesis 1:26,27; 2:17;
17	3:6	i; Romans 5:12-19).
18		
19		5. The Salvation of Man
20		
21	Ma	an's only hope of redemption is through the shed blood of Jesus Christ, the Son of God.
22		
23	a.	Conditions of Salvation . Salvation is received through repentance toward God and faith
24		toward the Lord Jesus Christ. By washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy
25		Ghost, being justified by grace through faith, man becomes an heir of God according to
26		the hope of eternal life (Luke 24:47; John 3:3; Romans 10:13-15; Ephesians 2:8; Titus
27		2:11; 3:5-7).
28		
29	b.	The Evidences of Salvation. The inward evidence of salvation is the direct witness of the
30		Spirit (Romans 8:16). The outward evidence to all men is a life of righteousness and true
31		holiness (Ephesians 4:24; Titus 2:12).
32		
33		6. The Ordinances of the Church
34		
35	a.	Baptism in Water. The ordinance of baptism by immersion is commanded in the
36		Scriptures. All who repent and believe on Christ as Savior and Lord are to be baptized.
37		Thus they declare to the world that they have died with Christ and that they also have
38		been raised with Him to walk in newness of life (Matthew 28:19; Mark 16:16; Acts
39		10:47,48; Romans 6:4).
40		
41	b.	Holy Communion. The Lord's Supper, consisting of the elements – bread and the fruit of
42		the vine – is the symbol expressing our sharing and divine nature of our Lord Jesus Christ
43		(2 Peter 1:4); a memorial of His suffering and death (1 Corinthians 11:26); and a prophecy
44		of His second coming (1 Corinthians 11:26); and is enjoined on all believers "till He
45		come!"

7. The Baptism in the Holy Spirit

2	
3	All believers are entitled to and should ardently expect and earnestly seek the promise of
4	the Father, the baptism in the Holy Ghost and fire, according to the command of our Lord
5	Jesus Christ. This was the normal experience of all in the early Christian Church. With it
6	comes the enduement of power for life and service, the bestowment of the gifts and their
7	uses in the work of the ministry (Luke 24:49; Acts 1:4,8; 1 Corinthians 12:1-31). This
8	experience is distinct from and subsequent to the experience of the new birth (Acts 8:12-17;
9	10:44-46; 11:14-16; 15:7-9). With the baptism in the Holy Ghost come such experiences as
10	an overflowing fullness of the Spirit (John 7:37-39; Acts 4:8), a deepened reverence for God
11	(Acts 2:43; Hebrews 12:28), an intensified consecration to God and dedication to His work
12	(Acts 2:42), and a more active love for Christ, for His Word, and for the lost (Mark 16:20).
13	
14	8. The Initial Physical Evidence of the Baptism in the Holy Spirit
15	
16	The baptism of believers in the Holy Ghost is witnessed by the initial physical sign of speaking
17	with other tongues as the Spirit of God gives them utterance (Acts 2:4). The speaking in
18	tongues in this instance is the same in essence as the gift of tongues (I Corinthians 12:4-
19	10,28), but different in purpose and use.
20	9. Sanctification
21 22	9. Sancuncation
22	Sanctification is an act of separation from that which is evil, and of dedication unto God
23	(Romans 12:1,2; 1 Thessalonians 5:23; Hebrews 13:12). Scriptures teach a life of "holiness
25	without which no man shall see the Lord" (Hebrews 12:14). By the power of the Holy Ghost
26	we are able to obey the command: "Be ye holy, for I am holy" (1 Peter 1:15,16).
27	
28	Sanctification is realized in the believer by recognizing his identification with Christ in His
29	death and resurrection, by faith reckoning daily upon the fact of that union, and by offering
30	every faculty continually to the dominion of the Holy Spirit. (Romans 6:1-11,13; 8:1,2,13;
31	Galatians 2:20; Philippians 2:12,13; 1 Peter 1:5).
32	
33	10. The Church and Its Mission
34	
35	The Church is the body of Christ, the habitation of God through the Spirit, with divine
36	appointments for the fulfillment of her great commission. Each believer, born of the Spirit,
37	is an integral part of the general church and church of the Firstborn, which are written in
38	heaven (Ephesians 1:22,23; 2:22; Hebrews 12:23).
39	
40	Since God's purpose concerning man is to seek and to save that which is lost, to be
41	worshipped by man, to build a body of believers in the image of His Son, and to demonstrate
42	His love and compassion for all the world, the priority reason-for-being of the Assemblies of
43	God as part of the Church is:

44 a. To be an agency of God for evangelizing the world (Acts 1:8; Matthew 28:19,20; Mark

ARTICLE XI. LOCAL CHURCHES

Pentecostal believers associating themselves as local congregations shall have the right of recognition by the Michigan Ministry Network provided they meet the standards approved by the General Council and the Michigan Ministry Network in regards to membership, doctrine, order, methods, conduct, and all other matters affecting the harmony of the Fellowship as a whole.

ARTICLE XII. DISSOLUTION CLAUSE

In the event the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, shall cease to function for 11 the purposes herein set forth, then all real, personal, intellectual, tangible and intangible, or 12 other property of whatever kind, and all assets remaining after satisfying debts and 13 obligations, shall be distributed to the parent body, The General Council of the Assemblies 14 of God, a Missouri non-profit Corporation, with headquarters in Springfield, Missouri. The 15 General Council shall have full authority to sell such property and to use the proceeds 16 derived thereof for the extension of the work of the Assemblies of God. In the event of 17 cessation of the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, its Board of Trustees shall 18 transfer all properties and any remaining assets, in accordance with the foregoing provisions, 19 within one year after the date such cessation. If such transfer is not made within the time 20 prescribed above, or if the aforesaid General Council shall be unable or unwilling to accept 21 the aforesaid transfer, then disposition thereof shall be made by the court of the county in 22 which the headquarters office of the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network is 23 located, provided that in such case proceeds of the dissolution shall be distributed to 24 organizations having purposes nearest the purpose of the Assemblies of God. 25

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ARTICLE XIII. AMENDMENTS

Amendments to the Constitution may be made at any regular or special meeting of the 29 Network Council provided the proposed amendment has been submitted to the Network 30 Secretary's office at least seventy-five (75) days prior to the session at which the amendment 31 is to be considered. The Network Secretary will present any proposed amendments to the 32 Presbyter Board prior to Network Council for their review after the Resolutions Committee 33 has prepared them. The Network Secretary shall send, by mail or electronic means, a copy 34 of the proposed amendment to the membership of the Network Council at least thirty (30) 35 days prior to the meeting. A two-thirds majority of all votes cast shall be necessary for the 36 adoption of a Constitutional amendment. 37

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When changes occur in the General Council Constitution and Bylaws that cause the renumbering or re-lettering of sections of those documents that are referenced in the Michigan Ministry Network Constitution, the Network Constitution may be amended to reflect those changes by action of the Presbyter Board, providing the changes are limited to such re-numbering and re-lettering items only, and that no change in the intent of the Network Constitution occurs.

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The Network shall be represented in the General Presbytery by three members.

- a. Qualifications. They shall be ordained ministers of mature experience and ability whose lives and ministries are above reproach who have resided in the Network for at least two (2) years.
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b. The Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, shall be represented in the General Council Presbytery by three members, which shall be the Network Executive Officers, by election to the office of Superintendent, Assistant Superintendent, and Secretary-Treasurer, they shall also be elected to serve as General Presbyters.

- **c.** Additional General Presbyter Representation. Two (2) additional General Presbyters from the Great Lakes area, one (1) ordained minister under 40 years of age at the time of election and one (1) ordained female (no age requirement), shall be elected according to the annual rotating Network schedule set by the General Council Executive Presbytery.
- They shall be nominated in the following manner:

It is recommended that all officers of a local church meet the following minimum requirements:

- **a**. Meet the minimum requirements for membership.
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- **b**. Be at least twenty-one (21) years of age.
- **c.** Have been an active member of the church for at least one year. "Not a novice..." (1 Timothy 3:6,8-13).
- d. Hold to a high standard of Christian marriage. It is recommended that married 16 persons are ineligible if either marriage partner has a former spouse living, except for 17 an ecclesiastical annulment where deception and fraud was involved or when the 18 divorce occurred prior to conversion (2 Corinthians 5:17) or for the scriptural causes 19 of a former spouse's marital unfaithfulness (Matthew 19:9) or the abandonment of 20 the believer by the unbeliever (1 Corinthians 7:10-15) or in the case of domestic 21 violence by a spouse to a spouse or child (Psalms 11:5; 146:5–9; Proverbs 6:16; Isaiah 22 1:16–17; Ephesians 4:1–3, 31–32; Ephesians 5) (General Council Bylaws, Article IX, 23 Section 5 subsection a.) 24
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Section 6. Transfer of Membership

28 **Transfer to or from an Assemblies of God church**. When an individual desires to transfer 29 membership from an Assemblies of God church to another Assemblies of God church, a 30 letter of transfer of membership shall be required. The letter of transfer of membership 31 should be provided by the Pastor/Board and granted upon the request of the individual. 32 The letter should state whether or not the individual is in good standing and be sent by 33 mail or electronic means. Responsibility for accepting or rejecting the transferee shall 34 rest with the Official Board of the receiving church.

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- Section 7. Network Assistance
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- a. Calling of Pastors. As soon as the Pastorate becomes vacant, the Official Board of the church shall notify the Network Office, seek the advice of the Network Superintendent, and invite the Network Superintendent to meet with its Pulpit Committee before making contact with any prospective Pastor.
- 43 If the Network Superintendent cannot meet personally with the Pulpit Committee,
 44 the Network Superintendent may send a designee.
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b. Advice and Counsel. All local churches of our Fellowship may request assistance or 1 counsel from the Network by contacting the Network Superintendent in any time of 2 difficulty or need by: 3 4 1) Written request of the Pastor. 5 6 2) A majority vote of the Official Board of the church certified in a written statement 7 bearing the signatures of two (2) members of the Board. 8 9 3) Petitions signed by twenty (20) percent of the active membership of the local 10 church. 11 12 c. New Local Churches Resulting from a Division. When efforts to maintain unity and 13 harmony in a local church have failed and a division results in a new congregation 14 being formed, the Network will exercise strong and wise leadership in ascertaining 15 the facts and seek to preserve Assemblies of God adherents for the Fellowship. 16 Within the bounds of ethical principles, sound doctrine, and Network policy, the 17 Network Officials should seek to retain any meritorious group with the Assemblies of 18 God. 19 20 Section 8. **Church Property** 21 22 It is recommended that all local churches of the Michigan Ministry Network include the 23 following in their Bylaws. 24 25 a. Incorporation. The church shall be incorporated under the laws of the State of 26 Michigan and all real, personal, intellectual, tangible and intangible, or other 27 property of whatever kind, shall be taken, held, sold, transferred, or conveyed in the 28 corporate name of the church. 29 30 31 b. Disposal of property. No real, personal, intellectual, tangible and intangible, or other property of whatever kind of the church shall be sold, leased, mortgaged, or 32 otherwise alienated without the same shall have been authorized by at least a two-33 thirds majority vote of the membership present at any duly called business meeting. 34 The proposed action shall be announced in the notice of the business meeting. 35 36 c. Certification. The Pastor and the Secretary of the church shall certify in such 37 conveyance, lease, or mortgage that the same has been duly authorized by the vote 38 of the membership. Such certification shall be held to be conclusive evidence thereof. 39 40 d. Defection. In the case of a defection from the faith as set forth in the Statement of 41 Fundamental Truths in the Constitution of Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry 42 Network, or from affiliation with the Assemblies of God, any portion of the 43 membership subscribing to and practicing the above mentioned Tenets of Faith, and 44 retaining their affiliations with the Assemblies of God shall hold possession of and full 45

- title to all real, personal, intellectual, tangible and intangible, or other property of whatever kind of the church with full rights under the provision of this Constitution and Bylaws.
- e. Church Closing. Should the church cease to function as an Assemblies of God church 5 for a period of ninety (90) days, title to all real, personal, intellectual, tangible and 6 intangible, or other property and assets of whatever kind of the church shall revert 7 to the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, an ecclesiastical corporation 8 organized under the laws of the State of Michigan with headquarters in Brighton, 9 Michigan. 10
- It is the parent body for churches in Michigan and is an integral part of the General 12 Council of the Assemblies of God, whose national headquarters is in Springfield, Missouri, organized exclusively to operate for religious purposes with tax exempt 14 status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. 15
- f. Reverter Clause in Title. Title to all real property owned by the church shall contain 17 a Network approved reverter clause wherein the property reverts to Assemblies of 18 God, Michigan Ministry Network, if the property ceases to be used as an Assemblies 19 of God church or for associated church purposes either as a result of defection or 20 termination as noted in subsection d. and e. above, or as a result of sale. 21
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Section 9. Sale and disbursement of closed church assets and property.

- The Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network shall forthwith have full authority to 25 use or dispose of closed church assets and property. Net proceeds from the sale or rental 26 of any property under this provision shall be used in the following manner. 27
 - a. 40% of the proceeds shall be designated for Church Planting in the Michigan Ministry Network to help with the initial purchase of land, buildings, and/or rental of buildings for new church plants. The Church Planting and Development Board will make grants for new church plants under the policies approved by the Presbyter Board.
- **b.** 40% of the proceeds shall be designated to church recalibration in the Michigan 34 Ministry Network to help with building repairs, sound, video and technology 35 upgrades, operational expenses such as utilities and grounds (winter/summer) 36 37 maintenance. The Recalibration Board will make grants under the policies approved by the Presbyter Board. 38
- c. 20% of the proceeds shall be designated to Michigan Ministry Network Camps for 40 debt reduction or capital improvements. 41
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ARTICLE X. MINISTRY

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Section 1. Requirements for Ministry

The requirements for ministerial credentials for the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, shall be the same as those stated in General Council Bylaws, Article VII. Ministry.

8 Section 2. Discipline

All matters regarding discipline of credentialed ministers of the Assemblies of God, Michigan
 Ministry Network, shall be the same as those stated in General Council Bylaws, Article X.
 Discipline.

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Section 3. Arbitration

Inasmuch as the Scriptures require Christians to take their disputes to other believers and 16 not to the civil courts (I Corinthians 6:1-8), all disputes which may arise between any 17 credential holder of the Michigan Ministry Network (including anyone holding a Layman's 18 Certificate) and the Network itself (including any officer or director thereof) while the 19 individual is a member, shall be resolved by binding arbitration if efforts to mediate or 20 conciliate the dispute have failed. Either party to the dispute may initiate the arbitration 21 process by filing with the other party a written request for arbitration within a reasonable 22 23 time after the dispute has arisen and efforts to mediate or conciliate have failed. In such a case, the credential holder and the Network shall each name an arbitrator, and the two so 24 selected shall name a third. All arbitrators must be born-again Christians, who have received 25 the baptism in the Holy Spirit (according to Acts 2:4) and who are members in good standing 26 of an Assemblies of God church. The third arbitrator chosen by the other two shall disclose, 27 before the appointment, any financial or personal interest in the outcome of the arbitration, 28 and any existing or past financial, professional, family or social relationships which are likely 29 to affect impartiality or might reasonably create an appearance of partiality or bias. Either 30 of the parties to the arbitration, on the basis of such disclosures, may disqualify such a 31 candidate from serving as a third arbitrator. A third arbitrator who serves without objection 32 from either party has a continuing duty to disclose relationships or interests which may 33 34 impair impartiality. Either party, regardless of the stage of the arbitration process, may, on the basis of such disclosures, disqualify such a person from further participation. The 35 arbitration process shall not proceed until the third arbitrator is selected. 36

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The arbitrators shall appoint the time and place for the hearing and cause notification to the 38 parties to be served personally or by registered mail not less than five (5) days before the 39 hearing. Appearance at the hearing waives such notice. The arbitrators may adjourn the 40 hearing from time to time as necessary, and, on the request of a party and for good cause 41 upon their own motion, may postpone the hearing to a later date. The arbitrators may hear 42 43 and determine the controversy upon the evidence produced notwithstanding the failure of 44 a party duly notified to appear. The parties are entitled to be heard, to present evidence material to the controversy, and to cross-examine witnesses appearing at the hearing. The 45

hearing shall be conducted by all arbitrators, but a majority of them may determine any 1 question or render a final award. If during the course of the hearing, an arbitrator for any 2 reason ceases to act, he shall be replaced in the same manner in which he was originally 3 selected. The arbitrators may in their absolute discretion admit as evidence any affidavit or 4 declaration concerning the matter in dispute, a copy thereof having been given at least three 5 (3) days previously to the party against whom the same is offered, but that person whose 6 evidence is so taken shall be subject to cross-examination by such party. The arbitrators 7 8 shall have the power to order and direct what they shall deem necessary to be done by either of the parties relating to the matters in the dispute. Costs and awards of the arbitration shall 9 be assessed at the discretion of the arbitrators. Any submission of a dispute shall not be 10 revoked by the death of any party to the dispute and award will be binding upon such 11 person's heirs and successors. 12

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The decision of the arbitrators shall be binding on both parties, and both parties submit 14 themselves to the personal jurisdiction of the courts of Michigan, both state and federal, for 15 the entry of a judgment confirming the arbitrator's award. The arbitration process is not a 16 substitute for any disciplinary process set forth in the Constitution and Bylaws of the General 17 Council of the Assemblies of God and the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, 18 and shall in no way affect the authority of the General Council of the Assemblies of God and 19 the Assemblies of God, Michigan Ministry Network, to investigate reports of misconduct, 20 conduct hearings, or administer discipline. Any matter not provided for in herein shall be 21 governed by the provisions of the Uniform Arbitration Act. 22

ARTICLE XI. MINISTERIAL RELATIONS

26 Section 1. Relationship to Network

- Loyalty. All credentialed ministers shall be amenable to the Network in matters of doctrine and conduct.
- **b. Transfers**. Assemblies of God credentialed ministers coming into the Network to reside shall be required to affiliate with the Michigan Network within sixty (60) days by filing a letter of transfer from their former Network. Inasmuch as unity is a vital principle for growth and spiritual development of the church, it 1 is essential that we recognize our relationship to each other, and that we practice Christian 2 cooperation in all our pastoral, evangelistic, missionary, and local church work. All 3 credentialed ministers shall be required to obtain approval of the Network Officiary before 4 ministering in any church not listed as an Assemblies of God church by the General Council. 5 This shall not apply to ministry in inter-denominational meetings and ministry in other 6 churches within their own locality. 7 8 Attitude Toward Those Removed From the Fellowship 9 Section 5. 10 In order to render effective decisions made in the interest of proper discipline and for the 11 protection of our churches, all who hold credentials shall refrain from taking an attitude 12 toward those removed from the Fellowship that would tend to nullify or set at naught the 13 solemn verdict of those entrusted with this responsibility. A minister who so offends shall 14 be subject to reprimand or, if persisted in, appropriate discipline. 15 16 **ARTICLE XII. WORLD EVANGELISM** 17 18 Section 1. Scope and Policy 19 20 Since the Master has declared that the field is the world, the Michigan Ministry Network 21 Council shall assume the responsibility to do all in its power to spread the full Gospel in the 22 23 United States and throughout the whole world. 24 Section 2. Organization 25 26 a. Network World Missions Director. The Network Superintendent, in cooperation 27 with the Presbyter Board, shall appoint a Network World Missions Director. 28 29 b. Network Missions Committee. The Network Missions Committee shall review any 30 applicant for missionary appointment under Assemblies of God World Missions and 31 Assemblies of God US Missions as directed by the Presbyter Board. 32 33 34 c. Church Planting Director. The Network Superintendent, in cooperation with the Presbyter Board, shall appoint a Church Planting Director. 35 36 d. Network Church Planting and Development Board. The Church Planting and 37 Development Board shall establish policies, budgets, new church planting strategies, 38 etc. Appointed members may be added to the Church Planting Board at the 39 discretion of the Network Superintendent. 40 41 The Church Planting and Development board shall have the prerogative to authorize 42 the purchase and disposal of all Church Planting and Development property. Legal 43 documents for the purchase and disposal of such property shall be approved and 44

- signed by the Network Superintendent and Network Secretary-Treasurer or their
 designees.
 - *Term of Office*. All appointed members shall be appointed for a period of one (1) year. They shall serve a maximum of five (5) consecutive terms with a one (1) term interim before becoming eligible again for appointment to this Board.
 - Section 3. Assemblies of God World and U.S. Missions Support
 - a. Missionary and Ministry Support. Every local church shall be encouraged to assume responsibility for support of duly appointed missionaries and approved ministries in cooperation with Assemblies of God World and U.S. Missions. It is the prerogative of each lead pastor and local church to present a plan that promotes faith and generosity that will work best in their local church setting to raise support for missional endeavors.
- b. Other nationally endorsed Assemblies of God missions' programs. Each Pastor is
 encouraged to promote giving to other nationally endorsed Assemblies of God
 missions funding programs.
 - **c. Missionaries**. Missionaries who itinerate in the Network with unrestricted itineration privileges shall send 5% of their offerings received in the Michigan Ministry Network to the Network Office to help support world missionary endeavors.
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25 Section 4. Planting New Local Churches

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The Church Planting and Development Board shall function under policies approved by the Presbyter Board. New local churches shall be recognized by all concerned as Assemblies of God churches from their very inception. They, except for Parent Affiliated Churches which are under the supervision and governance of the parent church, shall be affiliated with the Michigan Network as Network Affiliated churches and function under the Network Affiliated Bylaws furnished by the Presbyter Board.

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ARTICLE XIII. NETWORK MINISTRIES

- **b.** Loan Endorsement. The Presbyter Board shall be authorized to endorse loans obtained by local churches from banks or other sources up to the total amount of fifty percent (50%) of the capital investment fund of the Network.

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An annual financial review or audit, as determined by the Presbyter Board, shall be done by an independent certified public firm. The fiscal year of Departments and Sections shall conform to the fiscal year of the Network.
